The annual event took place at the KSU Alumni Center on Sunday, September 11, 2011. Approximately 230 athletes, coaches, and volunteers were screened that day for possible cardiac defects or conditions which often go undetected during normal check-ups. The event is in memory of a former K-State football player who died as a result of a cardiac condition. His mother Sharon Bates, organizer of the event, announced that the \$500 donation from Little Apple Pilot Club will be used to purchase an automatic external defibrillator trainer machine for Manhattan High School. Way to go, Little Apple!
